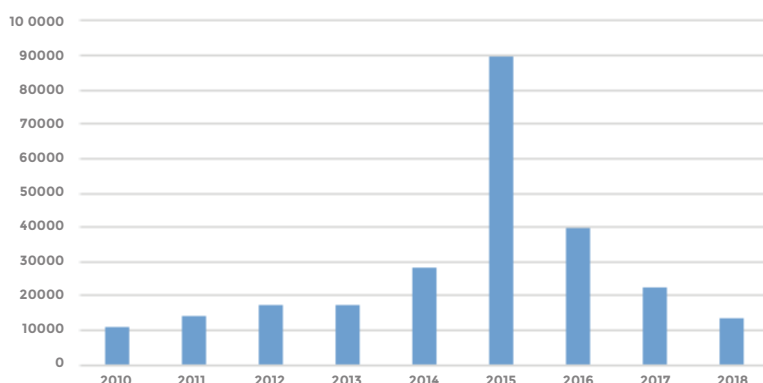

KEY INTEGRATION POINTS FACED BY REFUGEES IN VIENNA (2015-2019)⁷

- Public integration support from the very beginning
- Additional support from civil society
- Language proficiency
- Labour market access (mentoring/coaching needed)
- Trauma treatment (where necessary)
- Limited access to affordable social housing

To transform social relations regarding governance

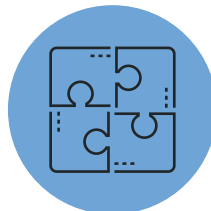


EMPOWERMENT DIMENSION
